SUBJECT: NATCON 2009 Minutes
Informational Memorandum

1. In accordance with AASMAN-1, paragraph 11.8, as well as 8.11.13, I submit this document, the NATCON 2009 Minutes.
2. AASMAN-1, paragraph 11.8, states: "The minutes of the NATCON will be published by the new National Business Chairman (former Parliamentarian) who will provide copies to the AAS and the SW National HQs, the SW National Business Chairman, each AAS and SW National Administrative Consultant, and the Executive Management Center (EMC)." This document is due NLT 30 days after the last academic final of the National Business Chair. My last final exam is on 8 June 2009, thus making the suspense 8 July 2009. Also, according to 8.11.13, "compilation of a package of changes to AASMAN-1 after the National Conclave and Fall Board of Directors meetings, NLT 30 days after adjournment, send the package to the National Administrative Consultant in charge of AASMAN-1." The National Conclave Adjourned on 12 April 2009 and I sent the packet of resolutions to 2Lt Tyler Johnson and Capt. Tripp on 16 May 2009.
3. I have sent the original copy of the minutes to our Executive Director, Brigadier General Richard Bundy, USAF (Ret.). Courtesy copies were sent to the AAS and SW National HQs, the SW National Business Chairman, and each of the AAS and SW National Administrative Consultants.
4. Upon completion of the National Conclave, 6 AAS resolutions were passed and 3 failed or were postponed indefinitely. Of the Joint resolutions, 3 were passed, 9 failed or were postponed indefinitely, and 1 was withdrawn by the sponsor.
5. I would like to congratulate the outgoing Executive Board on a job well done this year and wish the best of luck to the 2009-2010 Executive Board in their coming endeavors.

- g. Make sure you find your replacement this week and start spreading continuity.
- h. Make sure you give a contact list to your replacement when you find them.
- i. Gen Bundy handed out membership numbers AAS had 1812 renewals, that's 18 less than last year. We had 1,016 imitations, and I think with proper reporting we could be over 3,000 members! SW has 650 members down from 824, but I still need info from 12 chapters.
- j. We had a lot of trouble with people reporting this year. I just received three packets on Monday of this week.
- k. Things we need to fix now.
 1. We've had reports of CTOs hazing.
 2. We need to ensure people turn in membership and renewal packets on time.
 3. Integrity first, senior need to pay dues or else they cannot wear the cord. Four years ago we removed an area cc because they didn't pay their dues.
- l. Our dues problems are so big we almost need to raise dues. I estimate we lost \$3,000 this year.
- m. SW has heard nothing from 12 chapters. We need to contact these chapters and find out what is going on.
- n. Some good news, there is a new AAS chapter at University of Nevada, Las Vegas.
- o. The AAS/SW Alumni Association is growing thanks to the leadership of Lt Col Brown. I would highly recommend this organization, there is a meeting Saturday night; there will be free food and beer.

So my advice to you is to take whatever job you can, be flexible, and enjoy your time, because before you know it, it will be over.

q. Now some details of leadership.

1. Don't every underestimate your NCO's, they are the smartest brightest most educated NCO's in the world. I was assigned a SMSGT and he was the smartest most interested leader I know. Learn from those people. If you don't believe we have the smartest NCO's just think the AF is the only service where the NCO's send the officers into combat.

2. On my first assignment overseas I was tracking soviet missiles. Skylab has just been lost and we had a track coming up, we also had a championship baseball game. I was out supporting that when I noticed the radar was setting up early. I ran to the gate and got stopped by an airmen who wanted to see my badge. I argued that he had seen me every day for 9 months, he said he still needed a badge. As soon as he looked away I ran past, he called out halt or he will shoot I just kept running. I got in and set up for the pass, it was early and low, but it was the first sight of seeing a solar element that hadn't been deployed. I was back in uniform and had my badge when the base commander and my squadron commander came into my office. They asked what the hell I thought I was doing, and I recounted the whole story despite the fact that I could have just lied and said the airmen was wrong. That was showing integrity and taking care of my people.

r. I have many more stories but I don't want to waste your time.

s. So have a great time here. Have a great career. Best of luck to everyone.

 11. Initially the army and marine corps fought the IED battle.
 12. Quickly the army and marines were tasked out, so they asked the AF and navy to help.
 13. Soon the AF started sending units out to neutralize IED.
 14. On my third tour I was clearing routes through the city of Baghdad.
 15. The surge was going on at that time and I can tell you it was working.
 16. The terrorist had to start leaving Baghdad because striker teams were everywhere.
 17. This was my second tour with the 101st and 82nd airborne.

 19. On October 24, 2007 I got up ready to go for the day.
 20. Got a call for an IED near Cacock sometime in the afternoon.
 21. We were being called to an intersection where we had defused IED's before.
 22. Thought we had finished, but the last step is where the team leader walks from the truck and makes sure the area is actually clear.
 23. When I knelt down to check something a 50-pound IED exploded two feet from my face.
 24. I was thrown 25ft down the street.
 25. My team reacted quickly, I had an intelligence officer and a combat medic with me at the time. They managed to keep me alive on the pavement until be medevaced to Cacock.
 26. My heart actually stopped in the helicopter on the way to the hospital, but they kept me alive.
 27. I got to Balaad AFB where I had 10.5 hrs of surgery. They took my arm, and left eye and they worked on my right eye for a long time, and they wired shattered jaw shut.
 28. I then flew into Germany for more follow up surgery.
 29. Roughly 2.5 days later I got back to Walter-Reed.
 30. Where my wife met up with me.
 31. After 2 days there they sent me to Brook Harvey Medical center in San Antonio.
 32. I was unconscious for 2.5 weeks.
 33. When I came back I was covered in tubes and I could hear my wife asking me if I wanted to know about my injuries.
 34. At first I was confused as to why she was in Iraq.
 35. After awhile she told me about the explosion.
 36. She told me they had taken my arm, even in my heavily medicated and semi conscious state that was a shock, almost indescribable.
 37. You cannot imagine what it is like waking up blinded and having your wife tell you that you have lost your arm.
 38. Then she said that I had lost my eye and my soul froze.
 39. They also told me they weren't sure if they could make my right eye work again.
 40. I was in shock, it was dark, and I probably couldn't have answered what 2+2 was at this point. It felt like the world had been ripped from under me.
 41. Feelings of despair, hours rolled into days.
 42. I was so heavily medicated I couldn't tell you when I was asleep or awake.
 43. I would have dreams of seeing again then I would realize it was a dream.
 44. I began to think how cruel it was to let me live.
 45. With my job I had accepted that I could die at any moment of any day, but I hadn't prepared for being crippled in this way.

WHEREAS: Such an award could be a motivation for many squadrons, regardless of the current status of the squadron, be it excellent or poor, and

WHEREAS: This award puts all squadrons on a level playing field for the receiving and earning of this award, let it be

RESOLVED: That the General John K. Cannon Most Improved Squadron of the Year Award be created and continually sponsored by the John K. Cannon Squadron and awarded every year at NATCON, and let it be further

RESOLVED: The award recipient be determined by the National Awards Committee, and let it be further

RESOLVED: The recipient shall be reflected by a national ribbon for the active squadron members of that year and a permanent plaque with the awarded squadron's name with the associated year, and let it be further

16.14. **General John K. Cannon Most Improved Squadron Award.** This award is presented to the most improved squadron in AAS for the year and is sponsored by the General John K. Cannon Squadron. It is presented each year at NATCON. Selection of the recipient will be determined by the National Awards Committee. The award consists of a permanent plaque. Area commanders will include their comments on AAS Form 904.

16.14.1. **Criteria.** This award is based on the following categories of which a squadron must demonstrate improvement in each category:

16.14.1.1. **Recruiting.** This will be evaluated through the squadron's number of active members at the beginning of the previous NATCON compared to the numbers of active members at the following NATCON. This number is also compared to the size of candidate classes held by the squadron and the amount of students at the host school.

16.14.1.2. **Squadron Activities.** The effectiveness and number of unit-sponsored activities within the squadron are the qualities examined here. Include comments from the SW Chapter President (if there exists a SW Chapter at the host school), and squadron advisor indicating highlights of the squadron's improvement and activities (AAS Form 904, Blocks 8 and 9, respectively)

16.14.1.3. **Service Projects.** The effectiveness and number of service projects in support of the wide range of organizations and causes that the AAS sponsors from year to year. Include a project synopsis (AASMAN-1, Figure 16.2), a maximum of four one-page letters from the various organizations the squadron worked with during the year, and a maximum of four articles concerning the squadron.

16.14.1.4. **Fundraising.** The effectiveness and number of fundraising projects to help grow the squadron and increase the effectiveness of the squadron in furthering the mission of AAS. This will be evaluated by a percentage of increase of funds during the year, from NATCON to NATCON. This does not include the amount of money spent by the squadron during the year.

16.14.1.5. **Squadron Performance.** The Area commander will consult with his/her staff to discuss the squadron's performance which shall include but is not limited to standardized monthly reports completeness and timeliness; innovative directives and policies which help the society as a whole; joint relations with both AFA and SW.

RESOLVED: That a tie-breaker exception clause be added to AASMAN-1 12.3, and let it be further

12.3.1. Area HQ Tie-Break Exception. SUBJECT: General Rules and Categorization for Operations Hours

WHEREAS: There is no set instruction on the specific categories that are recorded in Arnold Air Society in the AASMAN-1, and

WHEREAS: Over the past year there have been many questions from Area Directors of Operations as to the specific guidelines on the hours breakdown, and

WHEREAS: The recording of hours is one of the most concrete ways in which to measure the progress of a national society, therefore let it be

RESOLVED: That there be stated in the AASMAN-1 specific guidelines and categories in order for squadrons to be better able to account for and record their hours, and let it be further

RESOLVED: That AASMAN-1 Para 3.11 and 3.12 be written as:

3.11 General Rules for Hours

3.11.1 **Members.** Hours only count for active Arnold Air Society members. If a service project is done in conjunction with ROTC members or with Silver Wings, the only hours counted are those completed by actual AAS members.

Hours for planning a project must not be counted towards the project. Only hours spent actually performing the project are to be recorded.

3.11.2 **Double Counting.** AAS members must not use AAS hours for warrior or honor flights within the corps. If AAS members must complete community service hours for an outside organization, they must not claim the hours as community service hours and AAS hours.

3.11.3 **Categorization.** The proper category will be determined by the squadron operations officer. If a squadron operations officer cannot resolve a classification issue it will be sent to the Area Director of Operations. If the Area Director of Operations cannot resolve a classification issue it will be directed to the National Director of Operations. The National Director of Operations will make the final decision.

3.11.4 **Counting.** Each hour of service done by individual members counts as one hour and should be recorded as such. All hours should be rounded to the nearest half-hour with the rule that any time after 15 minutes counts as at least one half-hour.

3.12 Hours Categorization

3.12.1 **Joint National Project Hours.** Joint National Project (JNP) hours are the primary focus of our organization and as such this category includes any service or fundraising hours that are collected in support of the JNP. These hours will only be claimed under JNP and should not be claimed again under any other category.

3.12.2 **Inter-ROTC Hours.** Inter-ROTC hours are those done in support of the local ROTC detachment sponsored by the AAS squadron. Examples of Inter-ROTC events are holding tutoring sessions or shining shoes for cadets in the corps. This category is a type of service, but is recorded separately to monitor how much AAS is supporting the local detachment. Joint activities planned by AAS and involving the local detachment are encouraged, but the only hours reported should be those performed by AAS active members.

3.12.3 **Service Hours.** Service hours are all hours of service done to assist outside organizations including the host school and the local community. The AAS squadron should not be paid for any service. Free food or giveaways from the event do not count as payment. POW/MIA ceremonies and tributes have long been part of the AAS tradition and are highly encouraged. POW/MIA hours will be counted as service hours.

3.12.4 **Fundraising Hours.** Fundraising hours are any hours that are directed toward raising money for the local AAS squadron. If hours are put toward helping another organization raise money or raising money for people outside the local AAS squadron, these hours should not be counted as fundraising, but as service.

3.12.5 **Professional Development Hours.** Professional Development hours will be calculated by the squadron operations officers as well as the Area Directors of Operations. These hours are events or projects that will help in the professional development of the AAS members. Examples of professional development hours include but are not limited to: attending lectures, practicing briefings together, or having a professional or military leader talk to the squadron about their experiences.

3.12.6 **Social Hours.** Social hours include events that boost squadron morale or squadron cohesion that do not fit in one of the previous categories. As a general rule, if it provides no benefit to the community, it likely falls under this category. These events must be open to all active AAS members and at least 50% of the active squadron members must be present at the activity in order for the event to be counted.

RESOLVED: A plan is tailored to the specific ETE and is approved two weeks of in advance of the planned event by the squadron advisor AND respective Area Director of Training, and let it be further

RESOLVED: That after the completion of the ETE an After Action Report be submitted to the National Director of Training through the respective Area Director of Training, and let it be further

RESOLVED: That AASMAN-1 Attachment 2 Para A2.4.3. be rewritten as:

A2.4.3. **Projects.** The candidate class must complete at least one service project that benefits either the cadet wing, campus, or community. Fund-raising projects do not fulfill this requirement. Candidate classes may complete no more than three service projects during their training period (e.g. the six to eleven weeks they are in training).

And let it further be

A2.9 Meetings. Candidates may meet no more than four hours per week, excluding service projects and Extended Training Exercises.

A2.9.1 Extended Training Exercises. Candidates may participate in up to eight hours of Extended Training Exercises. The Squadron CTO must provide a specific outline of the Extended Training Exercise to both the Arnold Air Society Squadron Advisor and their Area Director of Training. This plan must be approved two weeks in advance of the planned date by both the Squadron Advisor and Area Director of Training. After the Extended Training Exercise is over, the Squadron CTO must submit an After Action Report to the Area Director of Training who will then review the report and forward it to the National Director of Training.

A2.9.2 Extended Training Exercises Limitation.

A2.9.2.1. Time. Extended Training Exercise training time cannot be combined with the weekly four hours of training.

A2.9.2.2 Physical Training. No more than three hours of the allotted eight hours may be designated for Physical Training.

A2.9.2.3 Overnight Events. If the exercise is planned to run overnight candidates must receive seven unabated hours of sleep, the same amount given to cadets at AFROTC field training, hours of sleep do not count against the eight hours of training time.

This deposit fee may not exceed \$100 per room. This fee is to allow for hotels that may require an incidental deposit. This fee of up to \$100 must be refunded at the end of the National Conclave unless damages have been made to the room. If the hotel requires this deposit fee, NATCON staff must provide notice to the members of the societies at least two weeks prior to NATCON.
